As those who know me can testify – I can talk forever on compost, but this month I would like to move from that into an idea which has the enhancement of our

community at heart.

We are a bunch of people that is gradually growing in numbers. We come from a diversity of backgrounds, life experiences, dreams, hopes, objectives and intentions. Yet! - how much do we know of each other? Not much, eh? For myself, this community is feeling much more like a family now than it has done in the past. It's been a rocky road for me, but seeing all you new folks coming in gives me a much greater sense of belonging and this is my deepest need now, the knowledge of having myself a family that I can give to and receive from. So, I have a proposal, a suggestion, which you might like to consider and see if it can take us forward in an exciting and fruitful way.

"Getting to Know You"

Could we hold social sessions in which one person presents to us her or his story? Where we come from; our place of birth; our parental background; schooling; memorable moments; interesting anecdotes; anything we feel comfortable in sharing. It would not be compusary, of course, not everyone will want to. Fully voluntary, set in an atmosphere of trust, mutual respect, love and compassion.

Carefully but lightly facilitated, with a set of protocols agreed between us at the start of each session, in order to keep it safe and friendly. Interchange of

tacilitators.

I would envisage it taking, say, 40-50 minutes for the presentation, then 10-20 minutes for questions, followed by light refreshments and general chat. It would not be expected that everyone will be able to attend, but if it's set as a particular day each month, that might allow more people to make their plans to attend if they wish.

Often I hear individuals talking about little snippets of their life and it fascinates me to imagine what it was like in their "other" parts of the world. If I question someone about their country of origin, it's not in a sense of being nosey or judgmental, just a genuine interest in their background, full of respect and

welcoming.

There you have it: some of my ideas, let's try to keep it simple, not too complicated. Wishing you all a happy month of July, as we will see the Wattle coming out once again, to grace our beautiful land with multiple shades of glorious yellow.




